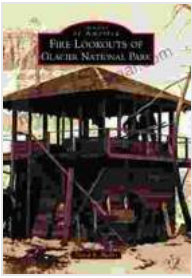


Fire Lookouts of Glacier National Park: A Visual History

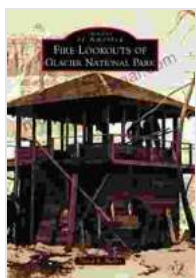
